1. STUDY PROGRAMME MISSION

The study programme's mission is didactic as well as research oriented. Thus:

- a) The Applied Linguistics Modern Perspectives in Teaching EFL MA study programme has both a didactic and a research mission in the training it provides for future: secondary and post secondary education teachers; research assistants in the field of philology; researcher in the field of linguistics; publicists; educational advisers; advertising copywriter (university studies); radio correspondent; special news correspondent (domestic and foreign); documentarian (university studies); editor; philologist; book reviewer; editor; literary secretary; reporter (university studies); writer; editorial secretary (university studies); company secretary; PR officer.
- b) The competences attained are stated in the academic curricula and course syllabuses. Moreover, these are clearly defined in the Diploma Supplements and are in accord with the declared qualification.
- c) The qualification attained by graduates in the *Applied Linguistics Modern Perspectives* in *Teaching EFL* MA study programme is in agreement with the national qualifications framework, defined more precisely under the **M50101002010** code.

2. STUDY PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

The Applied Linguistics – Modern Perspectives in Teaching EFL MA study programme advances a diverse educational offer, based around a double module - linguistic and didactic - in the area of advanced philological studies. It targets graduate students – under the Bologna system as well as under full term four year programmes – that wish to further their studies in order to teach English language and literature in secondary education, at the same time, opening a path towards PhD studies.

The student training mission of the *Applied Linguistics – Modern Perspectives in Teaching EFL* MA programme is organized around the following objectives:

1. Gaining a thorough knowledge of a particular field of expertise, and within this, of all specific theoretical, methodological and practical advancements; the ability to properly

use field specific jargon in communications with various other professional environments;

- 2. The ability to use field related knowledge for explaining and interpreting new developments pertaining to larger, field related contexts;
- 3. The ability to use the gained conceptual and methodological apparatus to solve new theoretical and practical issues;
- 4. Nuanced and responsible usage of evaluation methods and criteria in order to formulate value judgments and to correctly fundament constructive decisions;
- 5. Elaborate professional and/or research projects using a large array of qualitative and quantitative methods;
- 6. Successfully fulfill complex professional duties in an autonomous and professional way;
- 7. The ability to manage the activities of professional groups and/or institutions/organizations;
- 8. The ability to study in an independent manner, to self-asses formative needs and to be able to analyze one's own professional activity.

3. STUDY PROGRAMME RELATED OUTCOMES

a) General Learning Outcomes:

- To provide students with solid linguistic knowledge, skills and abilities to properly meet language teaching requirements.
- To acquire and make proof of efficient teaching skills for all educational levels, involving proper knowledge of teaching concepts and terminology as well as new developments in teaching English as a foreign language.
- To be able to properly and efficiently use planning and teaching principles, to critically evaluate new language teaching and learning practices, including those contained in the national curriculum.
- To be able to practice a critical attitude and a personal philosophy towards teaching, based on reflection, examination and integration of one's own teaching experiences inspired by current professional/society developments in addition to frame it within well-known and respected values.
- To be able to promote continuing professional development while cultivating open-mindedness and permanent self-assessment.

b) Intended Learning Outcomes:

- To provide students with knowledge on the conceptual framework, research techniques and procedures related to teaching. To provide them with knowledge about the relationships between research methods and principles of education, to be able to explore their research implications on teaching and to research one's own teaching learning context.
- To provide students with knowledge on assessment criteria related to English textbooks, to be able to produce teaching aids for field related textbooks and to adapt the materials and exercises used in class to the level and requirements of pupils or students.
- To provide students with practical and theoretical knowledge on testing and assessment; to be able to produce, manage and assess tests.

- To provide students with knowledge on the modern technologies to be used for teaching and learning foreign languages as well as on the methodological implications of using the computer and the internet.
- To get students familiar with E.U. strategies on teaching foreign languages; to be able to identify and explain the role of institutions and teaching methodologies on a European level.
- To be able to make the transition from practitioner to manager; to be familiar with the efficient managerial principles in education. To be familiar with notions of efficient teaching and the associated good practices; to be able to use behaviour monitoring strategies, to be familiar with assessment criteria with reference to the foreign language teacher and his competences.

c) Transversal Learning Outcomes

- CT1. Auto-control of the learning process, the diagnosis of formative needs, the reflexive analysis of one's own professional activity;
- CT2. Engaging in managerial positions related to the activities of professional groups or institutions;

- The sum of practicum hours and the diploma project practicum hours is 140+ 70= **210**, which represents 31,25% of the total no. of hours (based on an ARACIS recommendation minimum of 30%).
- The ratio between applicative subjects and speciality practicum is 60,41% (based on an ARACIS recommendation minimum of 60%).
- The ration between the practical applications and theoretical applications (seminars, labs, projects, practicum) is 1.5 (406 hours/266 hours) as per ARACIS recommendations (to maintain a ratio between 1,2-1,5).
- The Applied Linguistics Modern Perspectives in Teaching EFL MA study programme and its associated area (Philology) are included in the Register of university study areas

9. ENROLMENT REQUIRENMENTS FOR ACCEDING TO THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR. CONDITIONS FOR SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETING AN ACADEMIC YEAR. RE-ENROLMENT REQUIREMENTS.

The enrolment requirements for acceding to the next academic year, the conditions for successfully completing an academic year and the re-enrolment requirements are included in the ECTS Regulation as well as in the *Procedure for organizing the didactic activity and student grading*.

In order to accede to the next academic year, students must obtain a minimum number of credits, as follows:

a) In order to accede from the first year to the second, the student must cumulate 30 study credits;

- b) In order to be able to enroll for the dissertation exam, a student must cumulate 120 credits (a minimum of 60 credits for each academic year);
- c) In order to be successfully complete an academic year, a student must be accredited, that is he/she must obtain all study credits included in the curriculum plan for that particular academic year.

Students who fail to fulfill the minimum requirements stipulated by subparagraph 1 (a-c) shall be expelled at the end of the academic year. These students can re-enroll at the start of the next academic year within the same study year from which they have been expelled.

Students who within an academic year (2 semesters of the same study year) fail to cumulate the minimum number of credits, as established by the Faculty Council, in order to accede to the next study year shall be declared postponed i.e. "Postponed in order to allow the accumulation of all credits for the respective study year (years) ". Postponement of a study year can be granted for a maximum of 3 study years for the entire duration of the studies. The failed subjects are to be taken again together with the afferent didactic activity.

The student who at the end of his studies (after he/she has undertaken the number of semesters required by the curriculum plan) has not completely fulfilled his/her academic obligations and has cumulated a number of maximum 5 failed exams can request a (paid) extension for 1-2 semesters in order to re-take the failed subjects.
