### Information regarding Erasmus+ study mobility

The Erasmus+ program allows UAV students to carry out a period of study abroad, between 2 and 12 months, in a partner university, based on a bilateral agreement concluded between UAV and the respective university.

# Eligibility

Erasmus+ grants are addressed to those who, at the time of departure, are students enrolled at UAV in one of the three study cycles (bachelor, master, doctorate).

Other conditions that must be met to apply for an Erasmus+ study mobility:

- To be a Romanian citizen or a citizen of another country, registered for regular (day) courses at UAV, having a temporary or permanent residence permit, issued by the competent Romanian authorities;
- if the participant has already benefited from an Erasmus study grant, the total duration of the mobilities should not exceed 12 months/study cycle;
- not to be in the first year of study at the time of departure for study mobility (valid only for the undergraduate study cycle);
- to present a certificate of language competence (English/language of the country for which the grant is requested);
- to present a certificate from the family doctor attesting to the state of health.

### Academic Information:

Studies abroad are carried out on the basis of bilateral agreements concluded between UAV and partner universities. The agreements specify the fields of study for which they apply, the number of students and the number of months of mobility.

For UAV students, it is advisable to carry out study mobility for one semester (5 months, but this may differ depending on the academic calendar of the partner university).

#### Financial information:

## Erasmus+ grant

The amount of the grant varies depending on the duration of the mobility and the country of destination. See the amounts under Financing

The grant is not intended to cover all the expenses caused by the stay abroad, but only represents a contribution to the costs related to mobility. The students sign a commitment that, if they are selected for such mobility, they will co-finance the expenses related to the mobility from their own sources. The payment of the grant is made to the student in two installments: 80% in advance, when leaving for mobility and 20% after returning to the country and submitting all the requested documents. The scholarship at UAV is also received during the mobility period, if the student is/remains eligible.

# Stages of the selection process:

- I. The student chooses the partner university for which he wishes to apply, the selection of the destination university must be made taking into account:
- the compatibility between the courses in UAV program and those the student wants to study at the host university. The curriculum of the host university is checked on its website. Compatibility must be discussed with the Erasmus coordinator of the faculty to which the student belongs.
- the language of instruction at the host university.
- II. The student applies online, on the https://uav.topcode.ro/studiu/ platform, where he also uploads the requested documents.
- III. The selection committee of each faculty (composed of three teaching staff) evaluates the candidate students, through face-to-face or online interviews, as determined by the selection committee of each faculty.

The distribution of candidates who obtain the same score will be done taking into account the date of their application (first applicant, first selected). For each candidate, the commission, through the Erasmus+departmental coordinator, completes the Evaluation Form, which it uploads to the platform.

IV. The Erasmus+ department centralizes the evaluation sheets and compiles the list of selected students and the reserve list, then publishes the final list of selected students. Erasmus partners are informed about the nominated students. From this moment students can communicate directly with the host universities: with the Erasmus staff from the international relations department of the host university for administrative information - including accommodation, or with the faculty for academic information. To choose the subjects of study, the selected student will maintain permanent contact with the departmental coordinator and the dean of the faculty where he studies.
